



- The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time

2020! A new decade. A year where new adventures begin. The year even looks exciting in print. The number is orderly, the digits arranged in a pattern, the number itself a mystery to unlock. New adventures are not only in store for Aurora, but for Christopher John Francis Boone, the unlikely hero of *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*. Chris is a very smart young man with a unique perspective. Although his condition is not stated, he probably could be diagnosed with Asperger's Syndrome, a form of autism.

We became obsessed with this play when it debuted on Broadway in 2014 because it centers around several subjects it is time we talk about. "It's about difference, about being an outsider, about seeing the world in a surprising and revealing way." Those words come straight from Mark Haddon, the author of the novel.

It's also time we talk about the mysterious quality which Christopher lacks, that we in this community also sometimes lack - EMPATHY. In order to remain friendly neighbors, we need to acknowledge that WORDS MATTER.

Since the best place to learn most soft skills is in a theatre, let's practice: Ask the person sitting beside you, "Is this your first time at Aurora? "Isn't it miraculous what they are building next door?" "Have you met Anthony and Ann-Carol?"

These WORDS MATTER to us. Why?

- Your FIRST VISIT is important. We want everyone to feel welcome. So if it's your first time here, and you tell your neighbor, your neighbor will welcome you. We promise!
- What we are building is MIRACULOUS. We work in a city that believes in "cultural infrastructure." It doesn't matter if a developer erects a house if it never becomes a home. It doesn't matter if a town builds a sidewalk if it doesn't lead anywhere. It doesn't matter if a city supplies us with power and water, if it doesn't light our way or quench our thirst.
 - We want to MEET each of you, to know your names. We want to be FRIENDS.
 And when we see each other, let's agree to meet each other with KINDNESS.
 (After that, you can tell us what we can do better next time.)

Here's a great example: You might not be a dog person. That's okay. Bella understands that some people are cat people and we can be friends with cat people. (We can even be friends with people who feel like CATS is a good movie.) That's EMPATHY. Even for non-puppy-people, pets evoke that warm feeling that is delightfully MYSTERIOUS.

With the completion of the LPAC (Lawrenceville Performing Arts Center) at the end of 2020, there will be a million mysteries to solve. During the year, we will host many "listening sessions," where we can share ideas about the future. We cannot wait to meet with each of you and unlock the mysteries together.



SIMON STEPHENS (Playwright) began his theatrical career in the literary department of the Royal Court Theatre, where he ran its Young Writers' Programme. His plays for theatre include Bluebird (Royal Court Theatre, London, 1998, directed by Gordon Anderson); Herons (Royal Court Theatre, 2001); Port (Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester, 2002); One Minute (Crucible Theatre, Sheffield, 2003 and Bush Theatre, London, 2004); Christmas (Bush Theatre, 2004); Country Music (Royal Court Theatre Upstairs, 2004); On the Shore of the Wide World (Royal Exchange Theatre and National Theatre, London, 2005); Motortown (Royal Court Theatre Downstairs, 2006); Pornography (Deutsches Schauspielhaus, Hanover, 2007; Edinburgh Festival/ Birmingham Rep, 2008 and Tricycle Theatre, London, 2009); Harper Regan (National Theatre, 2008); Sea Wall (Bush Theatre, 2008/Traverse Theatre, Edinburgh, 2009); Heaven (Traverse Theatre, 2009); Punk Rock (Lyric Hammersmith, London, and Royal Exchange Theatre, 2009); The Trial of Ubu (Essen Schauspielhaus/Toneelgroep Amsterdam, 2010); A Thousand Stars Explode in the Sky (co-written with David Eldridge and Robert Holman; Lyric Hammersmith, London, 2010); Marine Parade (co-written with Mark Eitzel; Brighton International Festival, 2010); T5 (Traverse Theatre, 2010); Wastwater (Royal Court Theatre Downstairs, 2011); Morning (Lyric Hammersmith, 2012); an adaptation of A Doll's House (Young Vic, 2012); an adaptation of The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time (National Theatre, 2012); Blindsided (Royal Exchange, 2014); and Birdland (Royal Court, 2014). His radio plays include Five Letters Home to Elizabeth (BBC Radio 4, 2001) and Digging (BBC Radio 4, 2003). His screenwriting includes an adaptation of MOTORTOWN for Film4 (2009); the two-part serial "Dive" (with Dominic Savage) for Granada/BBC (2009); and a short film adaptation of PORNOGRAPHY for Channel 4's 'Coming Up' series (2009). Awards include the Pearson Award for Best New Play, 2001, for Port; Olivier Award for Best New Play for On the Shore of the Wide World, 2005; and for Motortown German critics in Theater Heute's annual poll voted him Best Foreign Playwright, 2007. His adaptation of The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time won the 2015 Tony Award for Best Play.

MARK HADDON (Author) was born in Northampton in 1962. He graduated from Oxford University in 1981, returning later to study for an M.Sc. in English Literature at Edinburgh University. He then undertook a variety of jobs, including work with children and adults with mental and physical disabilities. He also worked as an illustrator for magazines and a cartoonist for New Statesman, The Spectator, Private Eye, the Sunday Telegraph and The Guardian (for which he co-wrote a cartoon strip). His first book for children, Gilbert's Gobstopper, appeared in 1987 and was followed by many other books and picture books for children, many of which he also illustrated. These include the 'Agent Z' series and the 'Baby Dinosaurs' series. From 1996 he also worked on television projects, and created and wrote several episodes for "Microsoap", winning two BAFTAs and a Royal Television Society Award for this work. In 2003 his novel, <u>The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time</u>, was published and has been hugely successful. It is the first book to have been published simultaneously in two imprints - one for children and one for adults. It has won a string of prestigious awards, including the 2003 Whitbread Book of the Year. His second novel, <u>A Spot of Bother</u>, was published in 2006 and shortlisted for the 2006 Costa Novel Award. His first book of poetry, The Talking Horse and the <u>Sad Girl and the Village Under the Sea,</u> was published in 2005. His latest books include the novels <u>Boom!</u> (2009), <u>The Red House</u> (2012), <u>The Pier Falls</u> (2016) and <u>The</u> Porpoise (2019). Mark Haddon teaches creative writing for the Arvon Foundation and Oxford University.

LISA ADLER (Co-Artistic Director/Producing Director-Horizon Theatre/Co-Director) has directed or dramaturged more than 60 plays at Horizon, now in its 35th season of professional contemporary theatre, and founded the New South Festival of plays from, for and about the contemporary South. Critically acclaimed productions of Project Dawn by Karen Hartman, Detroit by Lisa D'Amour, Time Stands Still by Donald Margulies (Suzi Award Best Play 2012), Third by Wendy Wasserstein, In Darfur by Winter Miller, The Clean House by Sarah Ruhl, Nine Parts of Desire by Heather Raffo, The Syringa Tree by Pamela Gien, Quills by Doug Wright, and Skylight by David Hare, all directed by Ms. Adler, were voted top productions of their year by local media. She directed or dramaturged many of Horizon's New South Play Festival world premieres, including all three productions of The Waffle Palace (codirected with husband Jeff Adler), Waffle Palace Christmas, and Charm School by Larry Larson and Eddie Levi, Freed Spirits by Daryl Lisa Fazio, Third Country and The Perfect Prayer by Suehlya El-Attar, and Night Blooms by Margaret Baldwin. She is an alumna of the Lincoln Center Director's Lab in NYC and holds a BFA in Acting from the University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana, where she also returned for post-graduate study in directing.
