

When we are born, our imaginations run wild. Parents encourage us at an early age to dream: "What do you want to be when you grow up?" As children, we eagerly answer, "Astronaut!" "Movie Star!" "President!" Anthony & I have been dreaming for 25 years. First, our dreams were small. I wish people would come see our shows. I wish our air conditioner worked. I wish those 2 poles on the 2nd row weren't there. Now our dreams are bigger: I wish we had an orchestra pit. I wish we had a larger rehearsal space. I wish we could fly scenery.

Anthony and I recognize that we have been granted more than our share of dreams. So now, instead of dreaming, we try to find ways to shine a light on other people's dreams.

Because we wanted to tell this particular story in a true and honest way, we had to find NEW FRIENDS; and making NEW FRIENDS can be scary.

Other than Lilliangina Quiñones (and her husband Frankie who is on percussion), we had no idea where to begin casting. The great thing about Justin Anderson (and there are many by the way) is that he approaches each problem with a solution, and meets every person with trust, not suspicion. Then the salsa community adopted us, thanks to Chani Maisonet (our choreographer). As each person came into our lives, it was like opening one more gift, finding one more gem, making one more NEW FRIEND.

I am grateful to be even a small part of a story that is not exactly mine to tell. It is a truly American story nonetheless. But I can tell you, that as I hear each person raise their voice in song, as I watch each person move gracefully and purposely through the space, as I hear each person bring ON YOUR FEET! to life, it becomes apparent, dare I say crucial, that we make space for each person's story.





Thanks María & Max for bringing your magic to the South. More importantly, thank you to each artist who calls Atlanta home, whom we have had the extreme pleasure of making this journey with. This cast has helped me understand a little better one particular pair of courageous parents who left Cuba in search of the American dream. They had three sons, one of whom is a loud, passionate, one-eyed Cuban who always dares to dream the next dream; a man whose imagination still runs wild; who looked out his window the day we opened and asked, "What's next?"

So thanks, Gloria, for a lifetime of unforgettable lyrics that remind me, "When someone comes into your life, hold fast."

Now can this rain stop?!?! We have a building to finish.

ANTHONY RODRIGUEZ (Producing Artistic Director/Co-Founder) Aurora Theatre opened in the summer of 1996 and Anthony Rodriguez and Ann-Carol Pence established Aurora Theatre, Inc. as a non-profit organization in 1999. Under their leadership, the theatre grew from 120 season subscribers to the 5100 subscribers Aurora Theatre currently boasts. Aurora's success led to an ABBY Award nomination in 2002 for Arts Professional of the Year. Mr. Rodriguez's greatest accomplishment to date was the successful negotiation to relocate Aurora Theatre to downtown Lawrenceville, Georgia where it serves as the cornerstone for their revitalization. This nearly \$7.5 million complex houses 2 theatres, rehearsal space and offices and opened in the spring of 2007. Aurora's accomplishments include: Learning Library, an Educational Theatre Program, Aurora's Apprenticeship for recent college graduates, Aurora Academy and Conservatory where students learn about theatre from working professionals, Aurora's Musicals by Moonlight an annual outdoor summer concert, Cabaret and Comedy Series musical and stand-up comedy evenings between mainstage events, and Teatro Aurora, a professional Spanish-language theatre company that was created to highlight Latino cultural heritage and to help build social bridges in our community. Anthony is past Chair of Partnership Gwinnett and past Chair of the Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce, where he was the first Latino and Arts leader to serve in that position. Mr. Rodriguez is a member of Screen Actor's Guild, Duluth Rotary Club, is on the boards of NAMT (National Alliance for Musical Theatre) and TCG (Theatre Communications Group), and serves on the national steering committee for the Latinx Theatre Commons. Mr. Rodriguez is a graduate of Marist High School, the University of Georgia with a BFA in theatre, the Atlanta Regional Commission's Regional Leadership Institute and the National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures' Leadership Institute and Advocacy Institute. Mr. Rodriguez is a Cancer Survivor and has been cancer free for 28 years.

ANN-CAROL PENCE (Associate Producer/Co-Founder) arranged the music for Aurora's first Christmas Canteen in 1996 and was hired full-time in September of 1998 as Resident Musical Director. An education major at James Madison University, she used her background to develop Learning Library (or L2). As a musician, she created Aurora's Musicals by Moonlight, and Aurora's New Musical Initiative. She has performed as pianist and/or music director both nationally (Goodspeed Opera House, Pasadena Playhouse, The Cleveland Playhouse, The Kennedy Center) and locally (The Alliance, Theatrical Outfit, Georgia Ensemble Theatre, The Horizon). As a passionate citizen of Gwinnett, Ann-Carol is most proud of Aurora Theatre winning the first ever Pinnacle Award for Large Non-Profit and the first ever Moxie Award (for women led businesses). These go well with her 5 Suzi Awards for Outstanding Music Direction for The Bridges of Madison County, Les Misérables, Mary Poppins, Aurora's world premiere of Clyde 'n Bonnie: A Folktale, and A Catered Affair and multiple past nominations. Currently, Ann-Carol is a member of the National Alliance for Musical Theatre Selection Committee, reading 40-50 new musicals each year. She was a proud participant in the 2016 Atlanta Regional Leadership Institute and member of the "Best Class Ever!"




