



But right now.... we are waiting: waiting for the opening of a new building, waiting to be able to go back to work, waiting for the grace of healing.




"You can have the other words - chance, luck, coincidence, serendipity. Til take grace. I don't know what it is exactly, but Til take it." - Mary Oliver
