

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FROM THE PRODUCERS

"THE MORAL ARC OF THE UNIVERSE IS LONG BUT IT BENDS TOWARDS JUSTICE."

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s famous quote gives folks the impression that "justice" is inevitable and equally protective of all. Although I do not speak for all our communities, many of my Black and Brown peers would say otherwise. Justice takes work. No one person, no one group of people, can bring about justice alone. It is only by communal effort that great change occurs.

Feeding Beatrice will inevitably make you think, as does any powerful play. It may even make some angry because Kirsten Greenidge's play explores the complexity of attaining "The American Dream." Can we afford the perfect house? Are we welcomed equally in all neighborhoods? Why do we choose to live in a specific place? Do we all have equitable access to "The American Dream?" Beatrice embodies much of what many would describe as "The American Dream." She is gluttonous. She is relentless as she fights to maintain hold of her "home."

While no single play will change the world, this play examines the "horror" of racism. I promise *Feeding Beatrice* will make you feel. That capacity to "feel," to "show empathy" is a skill atrophying at an alarming rate. These soft skills take practice, we must authentically engage, see and create space for one another, in order to "feel" for each other. As children, we are taught to walk a mile in another's shoes; see through another's eyes. Nowadays, as adults we are far too quick to blurt out in anger, whether it be on social media, on the telephone, or in person. What do we gain when we are unkind?

So I challenge you to open your hearts and minds and to "feel." Consider these questions when issues lead you respond in anger:

Why lash out when we can civilly discuss? Why hate when love is so much more powerful? Have I really lost when someone else gained?

Great communities draw us in and welcome all. We strive to make Aurora Theatre a "beacon of hope for what a community of belonging should look like." But we cannot do that hard and worthwhile work without engaged and compassionate people.

Let's begin that work together.






LAC & AURORA THEATRE STAFF BIOGRAPHIES

ANTHONY RODRIGUEZ (he/him-Co-Founder/President & CEO) Aurora Theatre opened in the summer of 1996 and Anthony Rodriquez and Ann-Carol Pence established Aurora Theatre, Inc. as a non-profit organization in 1999. Under their leadership, the theatre grew from 120 season subscribers to the 5100 subscribers Aurora Theatre currently boasts. Aurora's success led to an ABBY Award nomination in 2002 for Arts Professional of the Year. Aurora's accomplishments include: Learning Library, an Educational Theatre Program, Aurora's Apprenticeship for recent college graduates, Aurora Academy and Conservatory where students learn about theatre from working professionals, Aurora's Musicals by Moonlight an annual outdoor summer concert, Cabaret and Comedy Series musical and stand-up comedy evenings between mainstage events, and Teatro Aurora, a professional Spanish-language theatre company that was created to highlight Latino cultural heritage and to help build social bridges in our community. Anthony is past Chair of Partnership Gwinnett and past Chair of the Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce, where he was the first Latino and Arts leader to serve in that position. Anthony is a member of Screen Actor's Guild, Theatre Communications Group, Duluth Rotary Club, and serves on the national steering committee for the Latinx Theatre Commons. He is a graduate of Marist High School, the University of Georgia, the Atlanta Regional Commission's Regional Leadership Institute, National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures' Leadership & Advocacy Institutes. Currently, Anthony is a member of Leadership Atlanta Class of 2022 #twoclasses. He is a Cancer Survivor and has been cancer free for 30 years.

ANN-CAROL PENCE (she/her-Co-Founder/Associate Producer) arranged the music for Aurora's first Christmas Canteen in 1996 and was hired full-time in September of 1998 as Resident Musical Director. An education major at James Madison University, she used her background to develop Aurora's Learning Library (or L2). As a musician, she created Aurora's Musicals by Moonlight, and Aurora's New Musical Initiative. She has performed as pianist and music director both nationally (Goodspeed Opera House, Pasadena Playhouse, The Cleveland Playhouse, The Kennedy Center) and locally (The Alliance, Theatrical Outfit, Horizon Theatre, Georgia Ensemble Theatre). As a proud citizen of Gwinnett, Ann-Carol is most proud of Aurora Theatre winning the first ever Pinnacle Award for Large Non-Profit, and the first ever Moxie Award (for woman-led businesses) for Aurora Theatre. These distinctions go well with her 5 Suzi Awards for Outstanding Music Direction. 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
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
