

FROM THE CO-FOUNDER

Every year, I hope the holiday season becomes the "Best Christmas Ever." From decorating the LAC to opening *Christmas Canteen* and *A Christmas Carol*, I want everything to be perfect. At home, I love decorating our trees. (One tree is solely dedicated to musical instruments.) As I pull out every ornament, I yell to Anthony who is usually in the kitchen, "Look at this one. It's my absolute favorite." My parents and I started getting Anthony Santa ornaments 28 years ago because he said he loved Santa one day in passing. I will admit my family went a little overboard.

Almost every year, one of these treasured pieces shatters. I become distraught, just like the mom in Tony DiTerlizzi's children's book, <u>The Broken Ornament</u>. I set up the Santa Hospital, where I use various glues, ribbons, and tweezers to repair and rehang. In the book, Jack breaks one into a million glittery pieces and says, "It's just a junky old ornament. We will get another one."

Then the book beautifully recounts why it is impossible to replace what is lost.



This Christmas, I feel like one of those shattered baubles. I just don't have the Christmas spirit. My mother Carolyn is now in assisted living, where I have set up my temporary office. She is my personal Christmas ornament. And when you ask about her, you mend her in the most beautiful ways.

Many of you in our audience are working to glue your cherished ornament back together too. What a blessing that so many of you share with me your health struggles, your challenges, and your losses. Carolyn has given me the gift of what it feels like to be broken and keep going.

Aurora needs more than a little glue and ribbon this season. Theatres all across the nation have closed, and Georgia is 50th in arts funding. Our ticket sales are wonderful. People are coming in droves to see our shows and attend our concerts. While *Christmas Canteen* plays our Grand Stage, there is something happening in all 4 of our spaces all the time and that requires staff to set up, tear down, sell tickets, and



man the bar. Plus, as a professional theatre, we are committed to artist compensation. We employ more than 250 actors, technicians, and musicians each year. But the fact is it is very expensive to operate the LAC campus. It costs \$500,000 a year to keep the lights on, make sure it is clean, safe, warm or cool.

To help Aurora continue our vital work, we received a challenge grant; an angel willing to match your kindness. So this holiday, please consider 2 things:

CAST BIOGRAPHIES



ANTHONY RODRIGUEZ (he/him-Scrooge, Et al.) a career non-profit leader, is proud to be the first Executive Director of the Hub404 Conservancy. HUB404 is an innovative 9-acre "cap park" that will soar above GA 400 and provide a direct connection to MARTA's Buckhead rail station. HUB404 will create a dynamic, active, gathering place for the Metro-Atlanta region and transform the core of Buckhead. Prior to joining HUB404, Anthony was President and CEO of Aurora Theatre, a professional theatre he co-founded 26 years ago. He currently serves on

various boards, both nationally and locally, including Georgia Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, National Alliance for Musical Theatre (Vice President), Theatre Communications Group, the Citizens Advisory Board for Gwinnett Clean and Beautiful, and the Advisory Board for Public Broadcasting Atlanta which includes the NPR station WABE and PBS station PBA30. Anthony is a past Chair of the Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce, the first Latino and first Arts Leader to hold that position. He served as Vice Chair of Arts for the Chamber and Chair of Partnership Gwinnett and serves on the National Steering Committee for the Latinx Theatre Commons. Anthony is a graduate of the Atlanta Regional Commission's Regional Leadership Institute, Leadership Atlanta (#2classes) and the National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures' Leadership Institute and Advocacy Institute, all three exemplary programs for leaders who want to spearhead transformational change in community. To date, Anthony's greatest accomplishment has been the successful negotiation that relocated Aurora Theatre to downtown Lawrenceville in 2007. Under his leadership, Aurora became the second largest professional theatre in the state of Georgia, producing 850 events and entertaining more than 80,000 visitors each year. Aurora's critical success inspired the City of Lawrenceville to invest in a \$35 million campus expansion. The Lawrenceville Arts Center (LAC) opened in October of 2021, and Aurora continues to serve as the resident theatre company and management agent. LAC now serves as a cultural gathering place and an arts education incubator for the entire Metro Atlanta region. Anthony, born in New York, and raised in Atlanta, graduated from the University of Georgia with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre. He resides in Duluth with his partner in life, Ann-Carol Pence, and their dog Bella.


TONY BROWN (Adapter) is honored to be a part of this annual Aurora holiday tradition. A member of Aurora's Summer Concert Series (*The Music Man, Guys and Dolls, Annie Get Your*

Gun, and The Wizard of Oz), he has appeared on Aurora's mainstage as Merlin in Camelot, as well as the Interlocutor in The Mystery of Edwin Drood and Colonel Mustard in Clue: The Musical. He also directed the Suzi nominated Over the River and Through the Woods. Tony is a senior company member in his 26th consecutive season with the Atlanta Shakespeare Company. Directing: A Christmas Carol (in its 14th year), A Midsummer Night's Dream, The Taming of the Shrew, A Man for All Seasons, Our Town, Cymbeline, The Comedy of Errors, The Tempest and King Lear. Acting credits exceed 3,200 performances, and having completed Shakespeare's canon. Favorite roles: King John of France in Edward III, Lord Capulet in Romeo and Juliet, Bellomy in The Fantasticks, Senex in A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, and every role Shakespeare wrote for Sir John Falstaff (Henry IV, Parts 1 and 2 and The Merry Wives of Windsor). He's also acted for Georgia Ensemble Theatre and acted and directed for Art Within. He wishes to thank the good people of Gwinnett for placing this theatre at the heart of its social and cultural life, and Tony Rodriguez for this glorious 11 year partnership.
